A. #2 The Pergialis theme. *Theme Pergialis : The wQ pins a piece, which is the only pinned black piece, and the threat is a pin-mate from another white piece. In the variations the wQ delivers at least four mates from different directions to the immobile bK, the one mate being by capturing the pinned piece.*

B. H#2 Theme: during the solution one Black piece unpin two White pieces.

Judge: Antonio Garofalo (Italy).

C. Fairies (Color Chess condition for #2 & H#2). Free theme. Judge: Bjørn Enemark (Denmark).

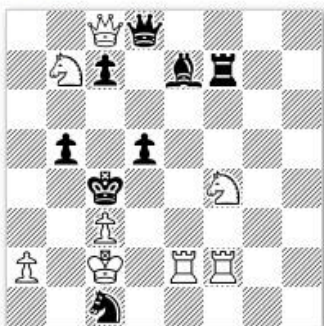
D. Ser-r#/=n Theme: mates on same square. Judge: Anatoly Karamanits (Ukraine).

The prize winners will have 1st Place, 2nd Place, 3rd Place etc. Only the first three will receive medals, the medals will be gold, silver and bronze. The winner of the “Cup of Bucovina“ will be the problemist who will participate in all sections. The preliminary and final awards of the championship will be sent to participants by e-mail and will be published on the “e4 e5“ magazine. Closing date: December 22nd, 2020.
